DAY 2 LIGHT SHINES THROUGH BROKENNESS

When I walked into Montclair Tabernacle, I was alone, hurt, sad, full of guilt and regret. I was just so tired of life.

I was raised and churched in the Pentecostal faith. I was saved at church camp and all through college was very active with my church. But, after I got married, life just took over. A demanding career, moving from place to place, having a baby, joining the army, Christ was no longer a priority in my life. We tried to find a church to attend, but used the excuse "Not the right fit for us".

Relationships became broken, a divorce, and my son and I barely communicated. My son got in some serious trouble and had to face some pretty tough consequences.

FINALLY, God had gotten my attention and I felt Him say, "Beth, what are you doing?! I am right here!! Come back!!" So, one Sunday morning I got in my car and drove up and down RT 234, twice. I did not see MTCOG's sign the first time, but as I was driving to go back home, It was right there. I passed it, turned around again, and turned in to the lot. I slid in and took a seat near the back. All I could do was cry. God just poured His grace out on me and It felt like a cork on a bottle popped off. Folks around me put their hands on me and prayed silent prayers with me. I did not know them, yet I felt they were really concerned and cared. I then began a long journey of healing.

After that service I was greeted by so many folks noting I had not been there before. I was made so welcomed. Like so many others say when they first came to Montclair, I knew I had a church home after that day. I was only a visitor once!

It has now been over 15 years since that day and Montclair is my second family. There has been so much growth in my life due to what has been poured into me by others.

It is now such a pleasure to be involved with MTCOG's serve and ministry teams: Woman's Ministry, Prayer team, Discipleship Ministry and Choir. Through my pain, I have been able to recycle it and become a part of other's lives to help them heal and find their path past their pain.

I was reminded recently that the peace of our souls does not have to rise and fall with unpredictable people and circumstances. The peace of our soul is tethered to WHO GOD IS.

Hebrews 13:5-6 (5) Let your conduct be without covetousness; be content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said "I will never leave you nor forsake you". (6) So, we may boldly say "The Lord is my helper; I will not fear. What can Man do to me?"

READ:

Ephesians 1:5, Ephesians 2:19, Romans 9:8, Romans 8:16

REFLECT:

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I AM YOUR FIRST LOVE

I grew up in a Christian home, went to church every Sunday, and accepted Christ at a young age, but beyond that, I would say I didn't have much of a relationship with God. I went to a Christian high school, and every year they had a two-day retreat. My freshman year, a group of us got in trouble: I don't remember what we did that got us into trouble. but we were told during chapel time if we walked up to the alter to be saved, they wouldn't tell our parents, and we wouldn't get in trouble. We all said yes....but I was the only one who walked up. Little did I know God would use that moment to change my life. I returned from the trip, and that Wednesday night at youth, one of the youth leaders said, "God showed me a picture of a small stream, and now the stream is starting to turn into a huge rush of water. That stream is God in you." It was then that I decided to really pursue a relationship with God. I was a "leader" in youth group and became a youth leader when I graduated. In my early 20s, I met my ex-husband; he wasn't a Christian. I knew better than to date him, let alone marry him but at the ripe old age of 23; I thought I knew what was best and how could anyone else be right.

Long story short, I didn't walk away from God, but I put our relationship on the back burner. We were a military family, I would take my kids to church, but we were never in one place long enough to make meaningful connections.

When we moved to Virginia, I couldn't find a church I liked. So I put God back on the back burner. I'd watch sermons online and still pray, but my relationship with God was one of acquaintances. When my husband left me to be with another woman, my mom recommended I see a family friend who did inner healing ministry. It was a three-day trip, we talked a lot, and I dealt with a lot, which started my journey to rebuild my relationship with God. I still didn't have a church I liked, but I pushed forward, God and me doing our own thing. At the end of 2020, I was diagnosed with aggressive breast cancer. I have spent the last two years with my head down, focusing on getting well and diving deeper into my relationship with God.

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God gave so many promises and affirmations during that time, but at the time, I couldn't see how any of it was ever going to happen. I had been praying that God would put Christian friends in my life. Even though my relationship with God was good, I missed the company of other Christians. On one of my trips back from chemo, we were driving by MT, and I heard God say, "you're going to go there when you're better." In May of 2022, My mom and I walked into Montclair Tabernacle for the first time.

That day Eva introduced herself and was so welcoming, but what really stuck with me was that she remembered our names the next Sunday. Being at MCT has been a feeling of coming home. Having other Christians to pray with me, encourage me, and pour into my life has filled my heart. There is nothing like being in God's presence and seeing him move during service. It's like watching a flower garden bloom, and because of MT's faithfulness and obedience to God, I am one of those blooming flowers.

READ:

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Malachi 3:6-7, Ephesians 3:18-19, Rev. 2:1-7

REFLECT:

First love for Jesus begins when the God-given tasting of His beauty and worth awakens a holy desire in us that refuses to be comforted except with God Himself. New, holy longings born of the Spirit of God lay hold of us, and we begin to groan and ache for more of Him until our aching is met with His fullness. These yearnings are not neutral. They alter the course of our lives and change our trajectories because they get to the bottom of our affections. When Jesus calls us, as He did the church in Ephesus, to return to our first love for Him, He is calling us to return to our first longing and desire for Him—to induce that thirst again. Through this He can bring healing to every area of our lives.

DAY 6 PRAYER WORKS WONDERS

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In 1988, about 20 years into my faith journey, one of my uncles passed away. Shortly after that event, I was driving to work one morning listening to a Christian radio broadcast. The speaker mentioned prayer as a part of the devotional life. I recall getting a strong urging from the Lord which basically told me, "Jeff, you need to start praying for your family (as in, my parents, dad's uncles and aunts and cousins)." So I began to pray. This was at least every week, but sometimes more than once a week. In the next few years, I saw the answers to prayer begin to come in.

First - my dad was lost and for 20 years had been resistant to the gospel. Syble and I had attended a summer seminar where we heard a pastor speak whose church was near my dad's home. Months later in a visit to my dad, I invited him to attend church where this pastor served. Thankfully, he agreed to go. The pastor had retired, but again by God's grace my dad liked this new pastor. He continued to attend the church. About 9 months later, I got a call from my dad. He had understood the gospel, got some important guestions resolved, and praved to receive Jesus as his Savior. Praise God ! Second - During those months while my dad was attending the church, we learned that my mother had cancer. Dad tried to explain his new faith to her, but to no avail. In July of 1992 (8 months after my dad's decision), the church visited my mom in their home. She trusted Jesus as her Savior. She was baptized in October that year, and passed away in December 1992. But she showed good signs of genuine conversion before going home to the Lord. Third - I continued to pray for the family. In 1993, one of my cousins in north Florida was doing Bible study with another cousin, all unknown to me. I got a call that the younger cousin had an accident at work, and died. Quickly I inquired about the circumstances and learned the following. The cousin who died had professed his faith in Jesus on a Sunday, then baptized the following Sunday, and then the accident occurred 4 days later. Fourth - at the funeral service (which I attended) the church was packed. This deceased cousin was the president of an old car club that year, and many of the members were present. Also present was another cousin from Sarasota FL. This cousin, along with 4 other men, raised their hands to profess Jesus as a result of the service and the pastor's clear gospel presentation.

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Fifth - several years passed. My dad's brother Giles, from north FL, professed faith in Jesus and attended church for a few years before his passing in 2000. **Sixth** - My dad's sister professed faith in Jesus in around 2003 a few years before her passing in 2005. **Seventh** - My dad's youngest sister professed faith in Jesus around 2006. Before her conversion, she was following new age teachings. She lives near my dad's youngest brother in south central FL. **Eighth** - Sheri, daughter of my dad's youngest brother, had been somewhat of a prodigal for years, having several broken relationships, and children by several men. She professed faith in Jesus around 2010.

Ninth - Jamie, a cousin living near my brother in Norfolk had a believing wife. He professed faith in Jesus around 2011, and served faithfully in a church in Nags Head, NC until his passing in December of 2022. Tenth - my brother, who was away from church after his profession of faith as a teenager, returned to the church, was rebaptized in 2006, and continues to serve as a leader (trustee, maintenance manager, and bookkeeper) in a church in Norfolk VA.

I continue to pray. God has worked slowly, but faithfully over the years in response to many prayers. One positive sidebar to note. The first of my dad's siblings to profess faith in Jesus found the Lord as a sailor in the US Navy in the early 1960's. I am sure he and his wife have prayed often for our family over the years. During my years in the Navy, in 1977, I got to meet the man who led my uncle to faith. One of those curious meetings that only God could have arranged.

Psalms 5:12, Matthew 6:23

REFLECT:

In order to live in the Favor of The Lord we must position ourselves in right relationship with Him in several areas of our lives. The Lord wants to favor those who diligently and fervently seek Him. Some of these important areas are: First-Living in the Favor of the Lord through Prayer. A major key in maintaining a right relationship with God and to live in the Favor of the Lord is through prayer.

In Matthew 6:33 the Word speaks of the importance of prayer- But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. (James 5:15-18 NIV) And the praver offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up. If he has sinned, he will be forgiven. {16} Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective. {17} Elijah was a man just like us. DAY 8 HIS WAYS ARE HIGHER

0 Even in my mother's womb, I believe that God's protection and • provision was over me (Psalms 71:6). My mother was very sick during her pregnancy and my parents decided to get an abortion. It wasn't until she was actually on the operating table of the clinic that she decided to not go through with the procedure. Born in Korea in 1975, we immigrated to the United States in 1980 in search of a better life and education for my siblings and I. Throughout all of the cultural and language struggles, God continued to show His faithfulness and favor to my family, and He always provided enough for us even in our very humble beginnings in this country (1 Corinthians 15:10). In the summer of 1990, I was led to give my life to Christ because I realized how much He loved me and that He gave everything for me through Jesus' death and resurrection (John 3:16). In college, I struggled physically with chronic back issues and my academics suffered as well. After months of unbearable pain and earning a less than 2.0 grade point average, I finally broke down and found myself praying to God asking for forgiveness for not fully being focused on Him. At the moment I began to pray and answered His call on my life (Isaiah 6:8), I felt the presence of God softening my heart and healing my body. After that prayer, my back began to get better and God allowed me to stay in school where I received my undergraduate degree and also obtained my Masters of Business Administration.

After I had prayed that same prayer in Isaiah, I could feel the power of the Holy Spirit healing my body but also empowering me to go and make disciples (Matthew 28:19). I began helping with a local Korean church in Blacksburg, VA leading children's Sunday school worship in 1995. I then served as president of Korean Campus Crusade for Christ at Virginia Tech in 1997 leading such activities as large groups and discipleship training. After graduating my Master's program in 2004, I married my wife, Helenann. We began to serve in youth ministry at a Korean church in Woodbridge, VA as we were living in Virginia Beach. Through prayer and the leading of the Holy Spirit, we moved to the northern Virginia area to more effectively minister to the youth. The Holy Spirit daily empowered us to lead youth activities such as missions' trips, weekly Friday night gatherings, Sunday school worship and classes. After over 5 years of serving the youth, the Holy Spirit led us to begin attending Montclair Tabernacle. DAY 10 HE'S STILL WORKING ON ME

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I grew up in the church with my father being a pastor and church planter as well as being in the military and my mother being an evangelist. I was the definition of the bad pastors kid continuously doing dumb things - doing drugs getting into a lot of trouble and really not truly caring about church or God in general. When I turned 18 I joined the Army as a way to get out of the house and serve my country. During that time I still went to church but I had one foot in the world and one in the church. I got out the Army in July 2015 and immediately moved to Nashville TN to continue my career in IT and pursue music.

During the short time I would experience a downward spiral. I got really badly addicted to cocaine and alcohol to the point I couldn't function without being drunk or high. During this time I was also dealing with an abusive marriage and the alcohol and cocaine was my escape to feel nothing. I got to a point were I would black out and wake up the next morning wondering how I got home. I tried to escape and made a decision that would make things a little harder and filed for divorce to get away from the abuse, but I still stayed in Nashville even though I had lost my job due to my addiction. I still continued to pursue music. I started to realize that things were continuing to go down hill when I would try to play music or write and I couldn't unless I was high or drunk. At that point I had moved out of my home to get out of the abuse but didn't have anywhere to go to so I lived out of my car until a could find enough money to stay in a hotel. At this point it was Oct 2015.

I remember sitting in my room opening the Bible and reading John 3:16-17 and looking up asking God if he really hasn't come to condemn me to save me from all this hurt pain and addiction. Oct 24th 2015 I sat in that hotel room and tried to commit suicide and was unsuccessful. That day I called my mom and dad and told them I have reached absolute rock bottom and have nowhere else to go. They told me to come home and I tried to leave that day but got into a really bad accident that made my car almost underivable however I still left going 55 miles and hour all the way from Nashville to Fort Belvoir, VA where my dad was stationed at the time. I drove all the way there while doing cocaine and drinking. I remember getting to my parents and not a single word was said - we just hugged and my dad said "God has the rest". I locked myself away for months until Feb 2016 to detox and try to pick up the pieces, all while asking God why I had to go thru this. I met my wife Angie in March of 2016 and I was still struggling with alcoholism and drug use but also serving in another church helping in the music and youth departments. I was not living right, but God was working on me.

Later that year Angie had told me she was pregnant with our oldest son. This was very hard as we were not married and having a kid, we were told by the church that we no longer welcome at there due to this. At this point I fell even harder to alcoholism. On top of that all the divorce proceedings had begun but I could not find my ex wife as she had ran away and took my daughter. Wow, could it get any worse. But again, God was working.

In Feb 2017 we started to go to Montclair Tabernacle. We immediately felt welcomed and Angie and I knew immediately that this was the place we could call home. In March 2017 my divorce was finalized but I was only able to see my daughter 1 weekend a month. I fell into depression again, but God was still working.

Angie and I got married on July 29 2017 but I was still working thru alcohol addiction, but I knew God brought her into my life for a reason. We had moved into a small town house in North Stafford together. Eli was born shortly after in November 2018. We continued to live life and I found out that my ex-wife was putting Nova in dangerous situations and we immediately filed for emergency custody and won in November 2019 and have had Nova full time since.

God blessed us with our last child Jonah in Sept 2021, from the moment he was born he has had a struggle where we were continually going to the doctor. He was unable to breath due to his lungs being severely congested. Through it all we have continued to stay focused on God and there is no looking back. I have to be honest and say that I m still struggle at times with temptation but I know GOD HAS MY BACK and He is still workin on me to make me what I ought to be!

I pray that I never become ungrateful for what he's done for me, and what he has brought me out of. My testimony still goes on and his love overcomes.



Then I had to repair it before I could sell it. After 3 weeks of this, I was sensing trouble, but I didn't know what to do. Then I headed to church. The sermon that day was on Malachi 3. I heard verses 9-10 explained, like I had heard before.

Then the pastor explained Malachi 3:11. Simply stated, this verse describes God's disciplinary action to those who refuse to give a tithe out of their income to the Lord. I left that day, knowing I had to change, and thankfully I did, as I returned to tithing based on my gross pay. In the years that followed, I continued to tithe. I saw my job threatened with layoffs several times, but it never happened. I saw a colleague laid off, and they gave me his job. I saw God bless my savings and investments beyond what others were receiving. I learned that if I gave regularly, God always protected me.

I met many people in financial stress who had incomes like mine, but they did not attend church. I concluded that they did not follow the Bible and that a failure to give from their income led to the trouble. So if you are not tithing now, I hope you will begin soon ! Start with 5%, but quickly increase it toward 10% as you see the Lord blessing, because he will.
