THERE IS VICTORY IN YOUR TESTIMONY

Over the next 21 days we will join together to experience first hand the power of what God can do in the lives of those we worship with each week. Romans 10:14-17 says "But how will people call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how will they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? DAY 1 BECOMING A SERVANT LEADER

I believe in evolution! No, not that kind, but I did get your attention. Let me
explain. As long as I can remember, I've been a helper, or a "willing worker" as I
heard it described by church ladies. I loved helping my mother and aunts cook and serve food, whether for a family meal at home or larger events such as family reunions or dinners at church. My "evolution" was from that of being a willing worker behind the scenes where I was most comfortable, to becoming a servant leader.

I grew up attending a Baptist church and have known about God, Jesus, and "Christian" things as long as I can recall. I know that Jesus is alive, He's a healer, a provider, a strong tower, a present help, and He will show up and show out when you call on Him. I was blessed to grow up surrounded by family members who epitomized Matthew 25: 35 "for I was hungry, and you gave Me food; I was thirsty, and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger, and you took Me in." I don't recall there being any homeless people in our community. I knew there were those who didn't have enough food, but there was always someone or the local churches that would provide food and other assistance.

My mother and father were two of those people. There were eight of us to feed, my mother and father and the six of us children. Yet almost every evening close to supper time, three of the neighbor children who lived behind us would show up. Their grandmother was raising them, and as a child I thought they were sneaking out to our house because they enjoyed my mother's cooking. As one of now eleven people sitting down to eat, I was concerned because I was unsure how Mom was going to stretch the food to feed an additional three people. But she did without even breaking a sweat. I learned later that the grandmother did not always have enough food to feed them. When I reflect on my life then, I realize we were probably considered poor. However, we were never without clothes, shelter, or food even with two adults, six children, and three extra children to feed. God does indeed provide your every need.

Witnessing first-hand how family and community took care of others stayed with me. I think that is why I have such a desire to feed and serve others. The words from two songs that my mother used to sing come to mind when I think of her and how she not only offered food to our neighbors but reached out to help in other ways as well, and always with a loving and positive attitude. My Living Shall Not Be in Vain You've Got to Accentuate the Positive Eliminate the negative, Hang on to the affirmative, And don't mess with Mr. In-Between."

"If I can help somebody as I pass along, If I can cheer somebody with a word or song, Then my living shall not be in vain."

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After getting married and moving away from my family and my hometown, I had to start "making" my own community. That's when I became an instigator. The dictionary defines the word instigator as a person who brings about or initiates something. I didn't set out to be one, it just happened. When I wanted to see something take place or to see something done, I would talk it over with other people, such as family, friends, co-workers, or neighbors. I soon learned that when you want something done you have to be willing to take the lead, and that's OK. It was like the Prophet Isaiah who answered the Lord and said, ""Here am I. Send me." (Isaiah 6:8). And here's the thing, not only do you have to be willing to take the lead, but you also have to commit to doing whatever it is you're going to do with a good attitude and with excellence. That doesn't mean you have to be perfect, but you're doing it unto God and He deserves our best.

As I said earlier, I'm more of a behind the scenes serving type person, but I've slowly and more willingly become a leader when needed. I keep in mind, though, that an effective leader must also be willing to serve. You can't be an effective leader if you're not a willing servant. Jesus Christ, the Messiah, is the perfect example of the servant leader. The story in John 13 when he washes the disciples' feet is just one illustration of His willingness to serve others. I can't imagine the Lord of Lord and King of Kings washing my feet! I would probably be like Peter at first, and then consent only if He let me fix Him a meal afterwards (Kosher of course). And this verse from the song "Through It All." It's another of my mother's favorite songs. There have been many peaks and valleys along the way, but I now know that the hand of God was always there, even when I didn't feel His presence. He placed me where I needed to be at the time I needed to be there to do what He had planned for me. I just needed to be obedient to His call. "So I thank God for the mountains, And I thank Him for the valleys, I thank Him for the storms he brought me through. For if I'd never had a problem, I'd never know that God could solve them, I'd never know what faith in God could do" Yes, God is in my story. He is in everybody's story, because He created everybody and everything. Trust in Him. He will see you through. His mercies are new every day. Amen.

Back in VA I told my friends to drop me at my car as I did not feel like staying out. The words "Jesus wants to become real to me" struck me. I know now the Holy Spirit was working. I started to lose my desire to go out and drink. Did not get High again, throwing out the drugs I had on hand. I knew was not saved and I could not keep the life up I was living because something was missing. So for several weeks I continued attending Church even changed to the neighborhood mission again.

One Tuesday night I was sitting in the living room watching TV, before remote and no cable or satellite. We had Washington And Baltimore channels. I flipped over several and there was Cliff Barrows leading a hymn on a Billy Graham broadcast. He was in Los Angeles.

First, something told me I needed to watch this. Second, a Young Lady shared about her life as a drug addict and living on the street but JESUS took it all away. And she sang the song "There's just something about that name" as she began to sing Jesus Jesus Jesus there's just something about that name. Master Savior Jesus like the fragrance after the rain..... As she sang my heart broke and the thing I needed was Jesus! I was awestruck by the Holy Spirit and then at the end of the message I knelt down on my Dad's rocker and gave my heart to Jesus!

Joy I had never experienced. A new sense of the World and my part in it! Excitement and hunger to read Gods word. And my life since has not been without trials and struggles including a dark period later. One thing I guarantee to you is Jesus said he would never leave you nor forsake you and in almost 50 years he has not, even when I was not cooperating. An old saying on a bumper sticker "No Jesus, No Peace! Know Jesus, Know Peace". Truer words no one has ever written!

DAY 3 THE HOLY SPIRIT TOOK OVER

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"All glory to God, who is able, through his mighty power at work within us,
to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think. Glory to him in the church and in Christ Jesus through all generations forever and ever! Amen." (Ephesians 3:20-21)

I think one thing that is important to know as a follower of Jesus Christ is to remember that He has given us the power and authority to do great things. It is also important to know that these gifts are for all who have received the Holy Spirit. That Christ dwells in our hearts. Lastly, know that each gift given from the Lord is not greater than the next. They all work equally to benefit His kingdom, do not be discouraged, the gift you have been given is special for you and there is a reason it has been given. Remember this, it doesn't matter the age we are, at the end of the day, we are all Gods children, and He has planned everything according to His purpose.

When I was young I would have dreams and visions. Being young I didn't know how to respond nor what to think about the things I saw. I was having visions of things that I had never seen before, and a couple weeks down the road, those things I saw would come to pass. I remember sharing these visions with a close family friend and my mother, who had shared with me Gods preparation and spirit moving within me. I remember being so amazed by the idea that I was given such a gift. It wasn't until later in my life that I truly began to understand this gift and how I was supposed to prepare my heart to receive the things God wanted me to understand.

When I was 13 I received the baptism of the Holy Spirit at the Church of God youth camp, this is where I spoke in tongues for the first time. Around this age I started to develop a greater understanding of Gods love for me, He began to change my heart, my desires, and called me into serving in ministry. Over time I began to receive discernment, knowledge and wisdom. Pray the Lord makes these gifts strong in your heart, you will need them in your prayer life, and when you are ministering to others.

The Holy Spirit took over as my guide and transformed my life. And then there was a time in my life like all followers of Jesus, where I went through pain and hurt and fell into a pit. Until God restored my heart and picked me up from out of that pit and filled my heart with the sweetest joy.

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After He had done those things, while I was in college Jesus and I began running together, and by running I mean He began to use me in so many ways. I was serving in ministry, teaching, and using the gifts the Lord had given me. He had made me bold, He told me to stand firm in the things He has given me. Even if it lead to persecution. And I began to receive dreams again, God had given me messages in these dreams not just for me but for others as well. Be sure that you are obedient when God gives you a message for another person, pray first and seek understanding. Encouragement for you, to pray for and over your dreams. Big and small, ask God to reveal the things you have seen so that they may benefit His children. I love to read Daniel and be encouraged by the things he that he has experienced. We often can relate and look to others in Gods word who have been given the same gifts we have been given. And don't be afraid to share the things the Lord has given you. And speak and sing in tongues often in your prayer time, let your gift glorify God in thanksgiving. When you are in church and you speak in tongues, pray that there is someone who can interpret so that His words will not fall on deaf ears.

It is also important to know that each gift from the Lord should be an action of the Holy Spirit not of our own selves but through His spirit. One of my favorite books in the Bible is Mark because we get to see Jesus perform all of these miraculous wonders, and there's a moment when the disciples question's Jesus about the possibility of healing. And Jesus looks to them and says "What do you mean if I Can? Anything is possible if a person believes." That has stuck to me, it has convicted me, it has directed my heart completely. Know that you have authority in Christ Jesus, to do many great things. So, do not be afraid to



ask God for gifts, as He knows your heart of hearts. Know that if you believe in your father, when you pray, believe that nothing is impossible for God. Believe in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Some time ago I asked God that, if I may receive the gift of interpretation that He would use for His kingdom. Not for the benefit of understanding what I am saying but so that others in Christs body may hear a message from the Lord, when tongues are being spoken. This year at Winterfest I had an encounter with the Lord where He spoke to me. And as I was immersed in his presence I began to hear tongues turn into words. And I knew it was God allowing my to understand. Little by little He has allowed me to interpret tongues as messages for others. I feel blessed by my father in Heaven that he has allowed me to carry this gift. In everything you do for the Lord let it be pleasing to Him. You will be blessed, You will see change, and you will be transformed. May God's grace be upon you.

In 1970 at the age of ten me and my eight year old brother were gently pushed into a Pan Am Airways jet headed for New York City. We were leaving all that we knew in El Salvador, running around the farm, creating mayhem for my grandmother. My mom had migrated to NYC earlier in 1967 to support what would later become a seven sibling family. My youngest sister would later die of brain cancer. Living in The Bronx was quite challenging and would become even more challenging when all our siblings would find out that my mom and dad were getting divorced. At the age of eighteen I left NYC to serve in the US Navy and I started a whirlwind life that would some day bring me to my knees. I lived a life of drugs, alcohol and hopping from club to club.

Growing up Catholic, giving my life to Christ was a foreign concept. One early morning, I happen to turn on the tv and the 700 club was on. Ben Kinchlow was on at that moment, doing what he did best, he was asking probing questions. He asked the following questions:

> Would you like to start a new life? Would you like to have unspeakable joy? Would you like to have your sins forgiven?

Every time he asked, I responded, YES, YES, YES. Then he said would you like to ask Jesus into your heart, at that moment with tears coming down my face I said YES.

He said pray with me... and right there I surrendered my life to Christ. That day I could not speak for another entity had come into my life, The Holy Spirit. I was tired of my dating life, so I prayed for a wife that would love me. Three months later I met Dee, and my life has never been the same. Four children later and many grand kids my life is beyond blessed.

DAY 6 TEARS OF INTERCESSION

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I grew up appreciating the power of prayer from a very young age. My paternal grandmother, Sara Wairimu (after whom I am named) was an Intercessor. If you asked her to bless a meal, she would pray for a minimum of 30 minutes; incorporating in her prayer the Church, the Nation, her neighborhood and would never forget to mention and bless her 8 children by name. My Mother introduced me to the "God who answers prayer". My Father had a habit of expressing his frustrations every time he drank and would make everybody uneasy. My mother would discern trouble before it manifested and would go to her closet and intercede. Within no time there would be peace and quiet. I watched her calm situations through her intercessions. Nothing would overwhelm her; nothing would take her by surprise because God would have revealed it to her in a dream or vision. When we became mischievous growing up and lie to her, she would just tell us "Don't bother yourself – I read the letter in a sealed envelope".

"Take it to Jesus" in prayer, and silence was my mother's response to her adversaries - and they were many. I believe anything close to Jesus attracts a lot of attacks. As far as she was concerned, the person attacking you, oppressing and spitefully using you - does not matter. He/she is just a tool in the hand of the devil. The position of God concerning the situation is what matters. For you the aggrieved, she would urge you to pray for them so the Lord would separate them from the devil who causes people to commit sinful habits. Once they are separated from the devil, you see the true nature of God in them. If you fight back, it is a losing battle and there will be no difference between the aggrieved and the aggressor. When you don't respond, it means you have a BIG GOD that is fighting for you. This was a great lesson to show the condition of the heart of the person who will pray prayers that God will answer. That holding grudge, taking offense, bitterness, anger, jealousy, pain of the past, unforgiveness, envy, etc. are unclean elements that create barriers between our heart (Spirit of man) and the Spirit of God. They keep our Spirits bound, and you cannot pray when your Spirit is bound; you need a FREE SPIRIT to pray. We should thank God for the adverse circumstances in life. God uses them to separate us from all these unclean and impure elements.

The second and most important lesson for me in prayer is that prayer should not be selfish – it should not only destroy the works of the devil but should also advance and establish the kingdom of God here on earth so that the will of God is done here on earth (in the family, in the Church, in the nation) as it is in heaven. Finally, that it is not possible to pray effectively without a burden. A burden of God's vision, a burden of God's purpose, a burden of what God seeks to achieve in a life, in the Church, in a nation, in a generation.

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The Bible talks about Nehemiah. When the report came to Nehemiah (Neh. 1:4), **"he sat down and wept, mourned certain days and fasted".** He prayed before the God of heaven. Nehemiah had a burden, a concern for Jerusalem, for the Jews. Yet he was not in need: he had a good job and salary in the city.

When there was a threat to the Jews in the Book of Esther, Mordecai responded. He did not take it lightly. There were forces that were going to annihilate the tribes. What is happening in our world today? Many people are in bondage, and the devil is using them at will. Let us ask God to impregnate us with the burden in His heart so we can intercede. Let us make it difficult for the devil to find men and women, boys and girls that he can use too freely. Let us partner with Holy Spirit to bring us to a new level of prayer that will save people from the wrath of God. Let us receive spiritual strength, vigor and vitality to align the people in prayer to the Lordship of Jesus Christ. The paths they have taken are paths of rebellion; they have refused Christ. They are tied to wickedness. We need to receive a fresh burden from God to pray.

We need to begin weeping for the iniquity in the land. We need to raise a cry, a mourning, a lamentation. Jeremiah 4:19 "My bowels, my bowels......l cannot hold my peace....destruction upon destruction.......". This was the burden in the heart of God because of the destruction that was coming upon the Israel.

Jeremiah responds to this burden in Jeremiah 9:1 – "Oh, that my head were waters, and my eyes a fountain of tears, that I might weep day and night, for the slain of the daughter of my people". Jeremiah began to cry for his people saying the tears were not enough for his eyes. He wanted to borrow from God a fountain of waters so that he could weep enough for his people.

When Ezra (Ezra 9) came to know that his people had committed sin, he went to the village. He began to weep, and to fast. He tore his garments; he plucked out the hair of his head and beard. It was like the shame of his nakedness and the pain of removing his hair and beard was nothing compared to the shame and the pain caused God by the sins committed. There are problems in marriages, there are problems with children, there are problems in the nations and in the Church and the purpose of God is frustrated. We need to raise a lamentation. There is a level of sin and iniquity in our societies that cannot be broken by just preaching. There are gates which cannot be opened without shedding tears for a highway to be made for Jesus.

We should ask God to give us tears of intercession – for wailing women to be raised and sent all over the nations, starting with our Jerusalem. We need to pray prayers that can give birth, prayers that will bring men into the purposes of God. We need to mourn like a woman who mourns because the only child she has died – so that the Lord may save us from His wrath. Amen and Amen.

DAY 18

LIFE CHANGE IS POSSIBLE

I have been a Christian since I was 9 years old. There have
been times in my life when I messed up. I was mad at God, I backslid
(turned away to worldly things drinking, and smoking cigarettes), but let me tell you something! Drinking did not help me, it just made me feel good for the day. When the hangovers were gone and the reality set in nothing had changed, everything was still the same. Now you may ask, have I been the perfect Christian? No, by no means.

When I was born, I was born with congenital hip dysplasia. The doctors told my parents that I would never walk. Well as you can see, God proved them wrong. I had 8 hip surgeries on both of my hips from the time I was born until I was 18 months old. Then in 2012 when my son was just 3 months old, I had to have major hip surgery on my right hip. I was in a hospital bed and confined to my house for almost 18 months. The only way that I could do anything was with the assistance of a walker, cane, or someone to help me around. Then in 2015 I had major hip surgery on my left hip. The doctors told me that there would be a possibility that I could walk with a cane or a walker for the rest of my life after both of these surgeries. As you can see God took over this situation as well. I am walking fine (the limp is from my broken kneecap). I again defied the odds after my surgery in 2015. I was on crutches the fastest the doctor had ever seen any patient in 21 days.

When I was in high school, I got mixed up with the wrong crowd. I started hanging out with a crowd that did drugs, drank, and skipped school all the time to go home and "party." I continued to hang out with this crowd until one night we were all in my friend's van, and they were all drinking and smoking. I should have called my parents to get me, but instead I stayed because I wanted to fit in. They dropped me off at home, and I got the third degree from my parents. They asked me to look into the light so they could see if I had done drugs or if I had been drinking. It was not long after they dropped me off at home that the police caught them, and they all went to jail and did not graduate from high school. God was watching out for me because had I not told them to drop me off at home, I could have been in jail with them.

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I have been married twice before. During those marriages there was mental, emotional, and physical abuse. While being married those two times I tried for 18 years to have a child. It was not until April 26, 2010, that my life changed forever. I went to the dr for a checkup. He ran some tests, and it was determined that I could not have children. I was a heavy drinker at the time and continued to turn to alcohol thinking it would make everything go away. I lost many friends because of my excessive drinking. I did not understand why God would do this to me. When the two things I wanted most in my life were for a man to love me for me and to be a mother.

I wanted to be a mother so bad it was one of the biggest desires of my heart. I did not understand why he would not allow me to have children. What did I do? Would I not be a good mother? I had all these questions. I just did not understand why. I continued down my path of alcoholism (because that is what it was). After 10 years of drinking and realizing it was not doing anything but making me feel bad the next morning, and my problems were always there. April 26, 2011, was a Sunday. I was getting ready to go to church, and almost did not go. I came to church and Pastor Gary Caruthers preached a sermon about "Coming back to God." Every single word of this sermon hit me like a ton of bricks. At altar call I went up front, and rededicated my life to Christ, and vowed that I would never drink again.

Well unbeknownst to me God was working a miracle in my life. I remember it like it was yesterday. My niece at the time of marriage called me at 9:18pm and said these words to me "I know you want a child and have been praying for one for a long time. I have a question to ask you but promise you will not tell anyone until the day after tomorrow. I did not put two and two together, and I said it depends on what you ask me.

She said I am leaving my husband, and I just found out I am pregnant. I want to know if you and Uncle would consider adopting this baby. If you do not want to adopt the baby the only other option is for me to have an abortion. I said you will not have an abortion, let me talk to your uncle and see what he says, but even if he is not onboard with it, I will adopt it regardless." So, I talked to my ex-husband, and he said sure because I know how much you want a child. So, I called my niece back not even 15 minutes later and told her that we would be adopting the baby, and I would start on the specifics in the morning. I do not believe this was a coincidence. DAY 19

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LIFE CHANGE CONTINUES

I strongly, faithfully, and whole heartedly believe this was a miracle from God because I had just rededicated my life, I had just prayed again about having a child when it was God's timing. It was exactly a year to the day I was told by my dr that I could not have children. I was able to go through the whole pregnancy with her. Doctor's appointments, the 3am cravings, stockpiled her with B & G Custard specifically Rocky Road. 8 months and to the day later at 9:18pm on December 22, 2011, I was able to be there in the delivery room and watch my miracle from God be born. That was almost 12 years ago, and I have been sober ever since. So, God was just waiting on me to come back to Him and keep my faith in Him that when it was His time, He would then open the door for me to walk through. I believe He opened the door that night and I thank Him and praise Him every day.

As time went on my ex-husband would not quit drinking. He told me he would quit anything but drinking. I had been and still pray for him to wake up and quit drinking. It was not until August 10, 2015, I came home from work, found my son halfway out of his bouncy chair screaming his head off because the only thing keeping him in the chair was his head propped up on the end of the bouncy chair. I dropped all the bags of groceries, ran to pick up our son and looked all over for my ex-husband, and I went upstairs to our bedroom and that is when I found my ex-husband passed out cold with beer cans by his bedside. It was then that I decided I had enough, and prayed about it for years on what I was to do. I know that we are not supposed to get divorced according to scripture, but I could not take it anymore. This was the last straw, and I packed our bags and headed over to my parents' house. God gave me peace about leaving, and I moved in with my parents that following weekend.

I rededicated my life to the Lord again at 35, and that was 10 years ago. A lot can happen in 10 years. Now you may ask, have I been the perfect Christian? No, by no means. It was not until about a month ago that I was so sick, and no one could figure out what was wrong with me and the pain of feeling like my head was going to explode, nausea, slurred speech. I was in and out of doctors' offices, The neurologist in the hospital had put me on two pain killers, and 2 muscle relaxers, on top of all the other medication that I take daily. Well, come to find out this paired with smoking cigarettes like a chimney because I was so anxious and again upset at God because nothing was working and I was going to all the specialists, multiple CT scans, chest x-rays, and MRI's but no one could figure it out. They just kept telling me it was the mother of all migraines, and that I need to continue taking my medication as prescribed. So, I went to my follow up appointment with the neurologist from the hospital.

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During this appointment he proceeded to tell me to continue taking my pain medication and muscle relaxers on top of all my other medication. He then proceeded to tell me that I had tension headaches, and migraines. He also stated that I had high anxiety and was severely depressed and that I should seek counseling. I did what I was told and after a week I still was not feeling right. I went to work, and worked as long as a I could, but kept having to leave early because my brain felt like it was swelling, and the pressure was intense and excruciatingly painful. I left work early and called my PC after hours number. Luckily, my PC was the on-call physician. She told me to go to the emergency room immediately and so my mom picked me up and we went to the emergency room, and it was not until then we got some kind of answer. He told me to stop taking all my medication that I do not take daily. So, I came home flushed both my pain medications and muscle relaxers down the toilet and have not taken any since, but I wanted to get a second opinion. I immediately started feeling like myself again. It was almost instantaneous relief 12 hours later. I saw another neurologist who I was referred to by my PC. I went to my appointment, and he took me off the migraine medicine and told me I needed to quit smoking immediately, that was a week ago. He said the medication that I take daily along with smoking could be what is causing my neurological symptoms. I went to my PC as a follow up this past Monday. She agreed with him, but also told me that I had been having TIA's (mini strokes). She said that I need to guit smoking because I am female, over the age of 40, taking medication that I was signing my death sentence. I am a ticking time bomb with a severe stroke or heart attack waiting to happen. It is only by God's grace and mercy that I am alive, breathing and here to tell you, my testimony. This was my wake-up call from God, and it brought me to tears when I came home. I immediately quit smoking on April 17th and have no cravings for cigarettes at all.

On April 23, 2023, I rededicated my life to Christ. My husband joined me up front and we left everything in God's hands. We both rededicated our marriage to God and that He is the head of our household. Now I realize what God has me on this earth for, and that is to be His disciple. I am to speak of my testimony and spread His word. I am to be the mother who helps keep my household in the word of God.

No matter what you have done in your life, there is nothing or no one that my Jesus cannot change. If you have a hard heart, I encourage you to listen to the words of "My Jesus" by Ann Wilson, download the Bible app, and get into the Word. There is no better life than a life with Jesus. Good works, strong faith, believing there is a Jesus will not get your name written in the Lambs Book of Life or to Heaven. The only way that you can ensure these two things is to accept Him into your heart as your Lord and Savior!

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DAY 20

Life started for me back in 1959 in a small midwestern town called Wood River, IL. I was raised in a Christian home with five siblings. Both parents were present as well. My father worked hard as a mechanic and mom was a stay-at-home mom. We had good structure in our home, not perfect by any means, but we were active with our little church as much as possible. Life seemed to take a much worse turn for me at age eight with older sibling problems that struck our family hard. Although we lived through the pain that was wreaking havoc on our family, we pushed through and stayed true to our faith in Christ. I was saved and baptized at the age of 14. That day was a turning point for me, and I believe it was pivotal for what was to come.

My father passed away when I was 15, and my mom died when I was 20. These were events that pushed me down a road of selfishness and sin. My life was about as far from God as one could get until one day in May of 1986. I had moved to Virginia that month and I worked for a company in Alexandria, VA. That day I walked into the office and saw that cute redhead sitting there and it changed my life. Connie and I dated that summer, were engaged at the end of the summer, and were married in May of 1987. During the first year of our marriage I rededicated my life to Christ and haven't looked back since.

Connie and I have been married 36 years now. We have served in various ministry positions over the years in churches in Virginia and Kansas. God has used me in several laity ministry roles as an associate pastor, foreign missions director, men's ministries director, KS state director of Lay Ministries, council member, church trustee, and teen youth pastor.

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I've always worked full time in addition to laity work, and I retired from the US Postal Service headquarters in 2018. God has truly blessed Connie and I in many ways. We have two children; Brandon (31) and Lauren (26). We are also blessed to have a wonderful daughter in law, Gabi Stewart, as well as two beautiful grandchildren, Hazel (7) and Clyde (4). Serving God is a priority for my family and I. Montclair Tabernacle has been pivotal in helping us serve God the way He has called us. We have been a part of MTCOG for 14 years now. What a blessing it is to have such a church family!

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READ:

Matthew 28:19-20, Hebrews 10:24-25

REFLECT:

The Gospel of Mark, Jesus warned His disciples that He would be killed and all of the disciples would scatter and desert Him. Peter, one of Jesus' innercircle disciples, emphatically exclaimed, "If I must die with you, I will not deny you (Mark 14:31)."

Jesus knew otherwise. Exactly as He foretold, after He was arrested, Peter denied he knew Christ three times before the rooster crowed. Peter failed Jesus, and we are told he "wept bitterly" over his sin (Matthew 26:75). However, after Jesus resurrected from the dead, He gave Peter a chance to reaffirm his commitment and fully restored him. Peter was given a doover.

Now, it can be easy to give Peter a little bit of grace here because this failure happened before he had the privilege of seeing the resurrected Christ. As far as he knew, this Jesus he had followed closely for three years may not have been the true Messiah because His arrest didn't fit the narrative of what the Jews had been expecting. The Messiah they were waiting for would rescue Israel from the Roman occupation through a great military victory. In the same way, as Christians, it is easier to give ourselves grace for sins we committed before coming to know Jesus as our true Savior. We easily apply unlimited do-overs to our lives before Christ. On the other hand, "big" sins that we committed after we became a Christian are harder for us to just accept a do-over for. We feel a bigger sense of ownership over our sin now. We should have known better, we should have relied on the Holy Spirit to h e l p us over come, and we should have turned from that sin...but we didn't.

PRAY:

Thank you God for your do-over power. Thank you for loving me in spite of my flaws and for your longsuffering towards me. I don't deserve it but somehow you keep allowing me to return. Give me strength to keep the faith, and stand strong even in the midst of temptation and pride. I am yours and I want to be a vessel in your hands. Amen
